Bits and Pieces.

We have just returned from a great holiday, sailing in a 23 metre catamaran down the Kimberley Coast for a week, with fishing every day, and loads of freshly caught crabs, oysters, & barramundi. Have always loved Broome, (our starting point) and we did the inland trip from Darwin down to Broome some years ago. It was a good trip, but.....

this trip was amazing, I am not a fan of smallish boats, but this one was the exception.

Carrying 12 passengers and crew of 5, (including a chef) it really was magic. Pulling up to a pristine beach for afternoon nibbles and drinks, climbing up hills to see cave paintings of the dreamtime. The tides rise 10 metres, and at low tide we were amazed as a gigantic coral reef surfaced, with a surface area of 325 square Kilometres, with water running continuously from the higher sections like mini waterfalls.

Birds make the most of their opportunity to feed on exposed sections.

This area is known as " turtle alley," because of the currents it is very popular with feeding turtles. One of the crew jumped overboard from the tender, and grabbed an unsuspecting turtle, held it close and brought him up for inspection.

We saw numerous waterfalls, I especially went to see the King Cascades, (a picture of this was the reason I started to investigate these holiday options.) At a delightful spot called Ruby's Pool, we could swim, and even sit under the cascading water, after the area had been thoroughly check for salt water crocs. Yep and they even swim in the ocean.

The last wet season was exceptionally "wet" so the waterfalls are still active.

The sea in WA is a totally different blue, the earth is rusty ochre, and the sunsets just are beyond belief. You are made aware of just how small we are in the scheme of things. There is nothing between us and the African continent, except that Indian Ocean.

Since we were last in the west much has changed. Each airport feeds hundreds of "fly-in miners" onto planes and helicopters of all sizes, to fly them in to the various mine sites. All wear their workclothes, so it is not hard to pick them out.

Planes land and disgorge those on the way home, through Perth and Broome airport, and planes are immediately loaded with those heading back to the mines.

I was aware of the "fly-in policy" but to see how many families are living that way was a shock.

It really was a great holiday, and I intend to go back. There is a number of boats doing these trips, and should you be looking for a fantastic Aussie break, I highly recommend it.

Broome itself is experiencing a building boom, with accommodation at a premium.

It is very different from the sleepy town we first saw 15 years ago.

New resorts, indeed new suburbs erupting everywhere. But the locals are still very friendly!

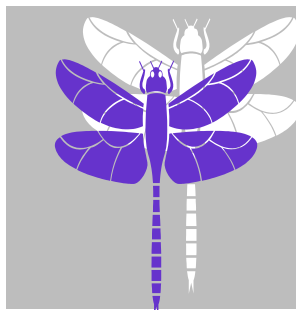

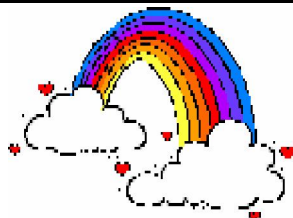
